

Conflict Minerals Policy

TPI Composites, Inc.'s ("TPI") corporate values of *Safety*, *Operational Excellence*, *Commitment*, *Integrity* and *Leadership* are part of our culture. Accordingly, TPI is committed to responsible sourcing and operating a supply chain free of "conflict minerals", which include cassiterite, columbite-tantalite (colton), gold and wolframite and their derivatives, tin, tantalum, and tungsten (or any other mineral or its derivative designated by the Secretary of State) which are sourced from the Democratic Republic of the Congo ("DRC") or an adjoining country (together, the "Conflict Region") and whose extraction, processing or trade are financing conflict in the Conflict Region. We support the goals established under Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the "Dodd-Frank Act") on conflict minerals and condemn human rights abuses associated with the extraction, processing transport, or trade of minerals and any direct or indirect support to non-state armed groups or security forces that illegally control or tax mine sites, transport routes, trade points, or any upstream actors in the supply chain. Similarly, TPI has a no tolerance policy with respect to corruption, money-laundering, and bribery. Our policy is communicated to our suppliers and is incorporated into supplier contracts.

TPI recognizes that avoiding the sourcing of all minerals from these areas would cause a de facto embargo with serious adverse impact on the living conditions of local populations in the Conflict Region. Therefore, we will not prohibit minerals from the Conflict Region when they are sourced in accordance with accepted international standards, specified under the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development's ("OECD") guidelines.

In support of this policy, TPI will:

- Undertake reasonable country of origin inquiries and due diligence with relevant suppliers in accordance with the OECD guidelines.
- Expect our suppliers to cooperate in providing information to confirm our supply chain is free of conflict minerals or sourced responsibly in accordance with internationally recognized due diligence guidance.
- Encourage suppliers to source from the Conflict Free Smelters ("CFS") program, when possible.
- Not knowingly purchase or use minerals whose extraction, processing or trade benefits armed conflict or human rights abuses.
- Comply with the reporting obligations by publicly filing reports with the SEC.
- Reserve the right to take appropriate actions should a supplier's efforts to comply with this policy be deficient.

TPI has a long-standing commitment to conducting business in compliance with applicable laws and regulations and in accordance with the highest ethical principles. We will continue to work with our suppliers to ensure they conduct their business in line with TPI values.
